FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR & BOARD CHAIR

While 2022 was full of successes, we have just as much to look forward to in 2023.

2022 marked a year of tremendous growth at Oakland Cemetery and for Historic Oakland Foundation as we expand our ability to deliver on our mission to preserve, restore, enhance, and share historic Oakland Cemetery in partnership with the City of Atlanta.

Notably, 2022 marked the completion of two landmark projects: the \$600,000 restoration of Oakland’s historic African American Burial Grounds (completed in June 2022) and the nearly \$2 million rehabilitation of Oakland’s 1899 Bell Tower building (completed in November 2022). We also spent over \$1 million in 2022 on the hardscape and landscape restoration of the Cemetery’s East Hill. The pace of this work, which we intend to continue, reflects HOF’s increasing capacity to successfully navigate complex, sensitive restoration projects.

Alongside the physical and capital improvements of 2022, we found new ways to share Oakland with our visitors and communities. In addition to special events such as Illumine, Sunday in the Park featuring Tunes from the Tombs, and Capturing the Spirit of Oakland, we celebrated Day of the Dead with a new community partner, the Mexican Consulate in

Atlanta. We also introduced new programming to serve families living close to Oakland. As a result of these programs, HOF saw more visitors than ever before (125,000 visitors in 2022), found new supporters for our important preservation work, and generated significant revenue to be reinvested into HOF’s mission to care for and share this sacred place.

While 2022 was full of successes, we have just as much to look forward to in 2023. This year, we will launch even more new programming, break ground on our new Visitor Center (the final project of the *Living History* Capital Campaign), and repave Oakland’s roads through funding from the recently approved City of Atlanta infrastructure bond.

All of our accomplishments in 2022 were the result of thousands of supporters and their time, talent, and treasure. We are especially grateful for the work of HOF’s dedicated staff; our passionate volunteers; and our tireless partners in the City of Atlanta, especially Sexton Sam Reed, Councilmember Liliana Bakhtiari, and Mayor Andre Dickens. Thank you all for your continued support.

FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS: *Restoration*

RESTORATION SUCCESS: OAKLAND BELL TOWER

In November 2022, Mayor Andre Dickens and other dignitaries marked the completion of a nearly \$2 million rehabilitation of Oakland’s 1899 Bell Tower building. The Romanesque Revival building at the heart of the Cemetery has served many functions since its construction (including housing Foundation offices and the Cemetery gift shop) and was suffering from significant overuse. HOF raised funds to rehabilitate the building, adding an elevator and ADA ramp to improve accessibility. The building is now a flexible programmatic space available to rent for meetings, luncheons, and private events. This milestone project is one of three in HOF’s first-ever capital campaign, *Living History*, and was made possible through the generosity of The Imlay Foundation, Invest Atlanta, Dr. Gerald and Mrs. Vivian Gowitt, and the Bruce Barfield Family.

FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS: *Restoration*

RESTORATION SUCCESS: THE EAST HILL

The 7.5-acre East Hill restoration project, HOF’s largest-ever, entered its third year in 2022. With over \$1 million in funding for this year alone, the preservation team completed the hardscape work on the southern half of the Hill. Nearly half of the hardscape work had been completed on the northern half of the Hill in 2021. HOF’s gardens team also landscaped 32 more blocks (128 individual lots) on the Hill, representing the largest-ever single-year improvement to Oakland’s gardens. We are on pace to complete the East Hill project in 2024. The restoration of the East Hill is one of three projects in HOF’s first ever capital campaign, *Living History*.

RESTORATION SUCCESS: HISTORIC AFRICAN AMERICAN BURIAL GROUNDS

Visitors to Oakland’s 3.2-acre historic African American Burial Grounds section in the last five years have noticed significant improvements to its hardscape and landscape. HOF’s preservation and horticulture teams have worked to restore the section since 2016, when Ground Penetrating Radar revealed 800 previously unidentified graves there. After five years and \$600,000, we were thrilled to complete the restoration and give this section of Oakland the investment it deserves. We marked the occasion with a ribbon-cutting ceremony attended by Atlanta Mayor Andre Dickens. Support for this restoration was made possible by the generous support of thousands of donors since 2016.

FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS: *Programming*

PROGRAMMING SUCCESS: DAY OF THE DEAD

On November 6, 2022, HOF partnered with the Consulate General of Mexico in Atlanta and the Institute of Mexican Culture to bring Atlanta's Day of the Dead festival to Oakland Cemetery for the first time. 9,000 visitors celebrated Día de Muertos and communed with the dead while enjoying music, dancing, crafts, authentic Mexican food, and entertainment. Catrinas and Catrines welcomed visitors to the free festival as the Cemetery continued its long history of providing visitors with a chance to celebrate life and remember the dead.

PROGRAMMING SUCCESS: ILLUMINE 2022

7,200 visitors explored Oakland Cemetery after dark last April as a diverse group of artists and creatives shined a light on Oakland's untold stories at Illumine. Visitors explored light installations throughout the Cemetery's original six acres, Bell Tower Ridge, and historic African American Burial Grounds by artists Valerie Crisostomo, Quiana Upton, Sherida Heath, Jasmine Nicole, Ellex Swavoni, and others. During the eight evenings of Illumine, visitors were entertained and enthralled by performances by Okorie "OKCELLO" Johnson, and encountered installations by partner organizations including Sweet Auburn Works and the Cherokee Garden Library. The unique after-dark experience welcomed a diverse new audience to Oakland, raised over \$110,000, and was significantly supported by the Fulton County Arts Council.

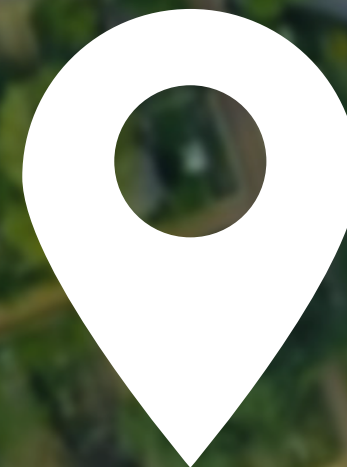
INNOVATION: COMMUNITY LISTENING SESSIONS

Oakland Cemetery is a vital part of the communities that surround it and has, for a long time, served as a year-round place of respite, recreation, and remembrance. HOF takes seriously its role as a community convenor and in 2022 began a new initiative to host regular community listening sessions in order to better understand our community's needs for Oakland and in order for HOF to be able to make strategic decisions in line with those needs. Led by Senior Director of Experiences and Engagement Jessica VanLanduyt, these listening sessions reaffirmed HOF's commitment to community service.



INNOVATION: GIS DATABASE

Since 2016, HOF has worked to digitize its burial, historical, and horticultural records and build a GIS (geographic information system) database to store and map this vital information. In 2022, we received a \$75,000 grant from the Sara Giles Moore Foundation to complete this project and make this information accessible to the public. When the project is complete later this year, the database and maps will be available through a web-based portal that will allow visitors to search Oakland's burial records and geo-locate burials. This map and database, together with the installation of new wayfinding signage across the Cemetery in early 2023, will provide a significant upgrade to the visitor experience at Oakland.

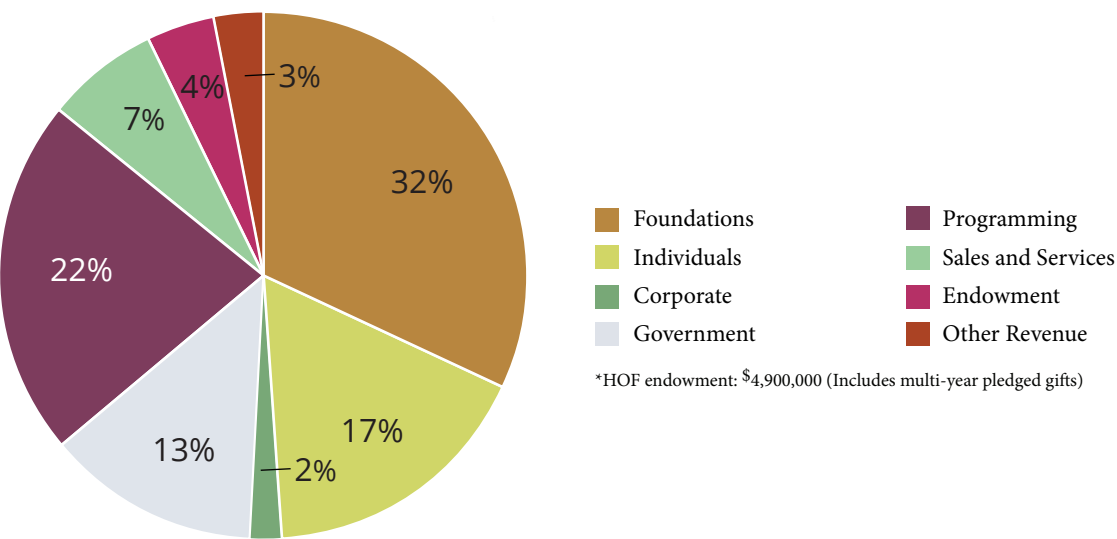

2022 REVENUE

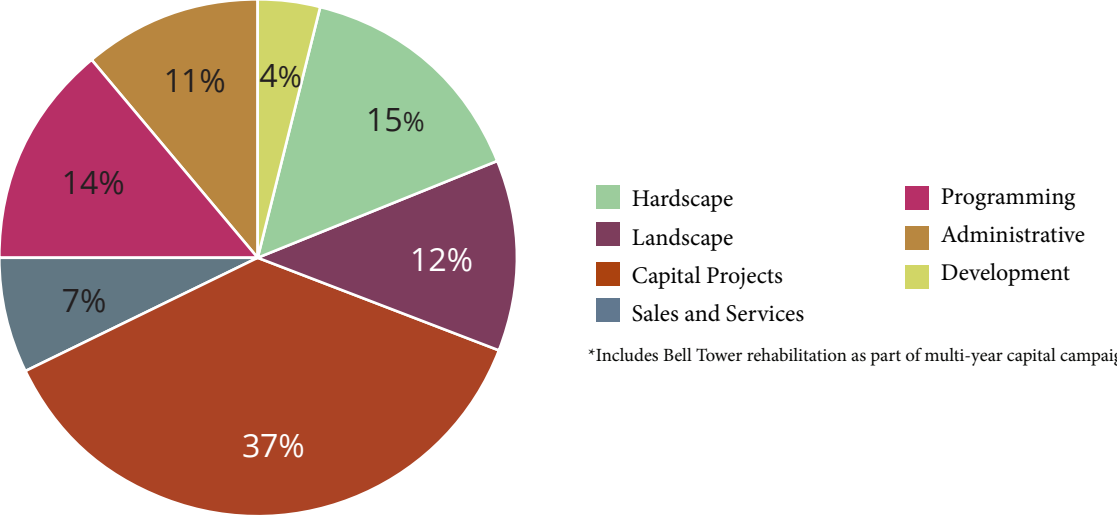
